Imagine that you are moving your family to a new country. Prepare a presentation to break the news and explain how their new life will differ from their current one.




Create a museum exhibit about a topic that interests you. Include pictures, written descriptions, and citations. Invite your family to the exhibit opening.

Research your own family history. Create a family tree as far back as you can trace.




Research food from ancient cultures, including Roman, Egyptian, Chinese, Greek, Persian, Mesopotamian, and Mayan civilizations. Find a recipe for food from one of these civilizations. Make it!



Choose one of the following rights movements to research: **disability rights**, **women's rights**, **LGBT rights**, **children's rights**, **animal rights**. Create a thorough timeline with pictures or illustrations.



Imagine that you are running for political office. Design a campaign poster, bumper sticker, and yard sign. Identify 3 problems you would solve and write about your proposed solutions.



Plan a month-long trip in which you would visit at least 20 significant landmarks. Here's the catch: no airplanes! You can travel by car, train, bike, foot, or boat. Make a map to illustrate your trip.




Look up your municipal, state, and federal representatives. Identify their responsibilities. Choose one of them to contact about a topic of concern to you. Do it!



Design a postage stamp to honor a significant historical figure. Write a proposal to convince the postal service that this person deserves their own stamp.






Design new flags for your city, state, and country. Explain the significance or symbolism of the colors, shapes, and symbols you use.
